- School Business Administrator's Report – Mrs. Lameka Augustin
- *The Finance and Physical Facilities Committee reports from January 15, 2020 were distributed to the Board Members. The resolutions that are being presented tonight are supported by the full Board, there were no comments.*
- Superintendent's Report – Mr. Giovanni A. Giancaspro opened the floor to the Public for questions on the January 28, 2020 School Board Referendum.
- ***The following statements and questions were brought forth to the Board Members; All questions were addressed by the Superintendent and Board Members.***

J. Martin – Enrollment is down, what did the Demographic Study state, if the Demographic is wrong something should be done. Also, the increase went up 30-35%.

L. Bongiovanni – Inquired about an OPRA sent to the Superintendent.

L. Ream – Inquired about the School Bond Referendum information on flyers that were sent out to the tax payers, what information is accurate?

Councilman Cronk – Stated “The Council supports the School Bond Referendum”. The schools keep putting band aids on the issues and it is not fair to the students, the schools are just burning money this way. We have been very transparent over the years on our stance.

L. Bongiovanni – Inquired about the number of Gymnasiums that will be included, he stated Becton H.S. makes four.

L. Bucceri – Stated “If the referendum had passed the first time we would not be in this current situation”. It's a shame we are spending money on band aids. I care about the students in these schools although, I don't have any children attending them, Carlstadt has beautiful facilities we need better facilities, our students deserve them.

L. Bongiovanni – Stated for the record “We never knock East Rutherford, this Board has whipped Becton for the third time stating that we were not on board with students moving to Becton, we are a Regional H.S. and Carlstadt would have to be on board as well, I am tired of hearing this”.

S. Segalini – Stated “I too knocked on doors supporting the American Dream, I would have done things differently stock piling the money for 5-10 years and not giving it all one shot”. Regarding the McKenzie roof does the roof have a warranty? I don't understand the 35.5 million, I have been to all the meetings and the number keeps increasing. Did the school use the same Professionals as first referendum and how were they chosen? Last March it seemed like you were getting more State Aid on the project, is that accurate? Does the swap of the Franklin land still exist? At one meeting the PTA President stated the Mayor and Council agreed to pay for the McKenzie floor, is this true? At the Senior Citizen meeting held Mr. Giancaspro stated that if the referendum doesn't pass the Civic Center land may be an option, I have had a lot of Seniors call me worried about this, is this accurate? Why can't the town build the school if the rates are cheaper for them to Bond?

J. Zoller – I saw a video from a person stating that the furniture wasn't included, the person is putting out a lot of false information, this same person brought two properties in East Rutherford. The only reason the person is campaigning to say no to this referendum is because he isn't in office.

R. Cruz – Expressed how this became a political issue and no longer a safety issue for the children and staff, she thanked the Board for supporting the children of East Rutherford and is disgusted with peoples comments and false information, it’s their need for attention.

Councilman Stallone – The false propaganda about the Mayor and Council and referendum is illegal. It’s all not true, when in need we built for the Seniors and the Police in turn it cost the town nothing. It’s time to help the children they deserve it. Our taxes are the lowest in Bergen County, we have to spend some money. We’re doing the best we can to stop or slow down expansion in the town.
